The Front were kept well away from the much larger Anti-Fascist Action march, which went to the Imperial War Museum for a public meeting. A small group was allowed to lay four wreaths in memory of the victims of racist attacks and murders in Britain today. One was laid by Celia Stubbs, the friend of Blair Peach, who was killed at a demonstration against the National Front in Southall in 1979.

A feminist slogan painted on the cenotaph in Bristol was removed in time for the morning's official service. "Dead men don't rape," was sprayed in red. Two women were arrested.
